	<p>5. Strong shelter organization built.¹</p> <p><i>As a result of increased shelter stability on-reserve communities will be stabilized; fewer children will be in care; crime statistics will decrease. In short, on-reserve social capital will be developed as the shelter becomes rooted and contributes to building up a healthy community around it.</i></p>				

¹ Please note that Outcome 5 derives from the identified outcomes in the On-reserve shelters logframe: 1. Spirituality built; 2. Community healing fostered; 3. Life skills built; 4. Leadership support attained for the on-reserve project of building-up healthy communities. Note: Violence is a symptom of unhealthy community. In order to address it, the whole community, in all its aspects, needs to be healthy. That is why these outcomes (behaviour changes; changes in condition to which the on-reserve shelters contribute) focus on healthy community and not on the prevention of violence, per se.

					<p>It is understood that the on-reserve shelters concurrently build their own organizational capacity for each of the four outcomes identified here.</p> <p>The risk is that if the shelters don't work towards these outcomes independently, the RO is not a sufficient response to the identified needs. The RO contributes to the realization of these outputs, through the activities outlined in this logframe.</p> <p>Finally, it is necessary that the RO be set up according to best practise, with respect to: RO Board; Organization status; Terms of Reference; Partnership mandate with ACWS, etc.</p> <p>Logframe for RO is needed to outline the above.</p>

² NB: outputs for outcomes 2 (Community healing fostered) and 4 (Leadership support attained for the on-reserve project of building up healthy communities) contribute strongly to this outcome, too.
