I am writing to you as a representative of the newly formed, "Feminist Lesbians On Campus"- a reading, research group at the University of Alberta, to make a request that we use the Research Centre as a meeting place. We are a reading group, designed to approach research, written by and about lesbians, in order to create a lesbian space, for both faculty and students, within the academic community to critically explore that research and its implications for further research and dialogue within both Women's Studies and the general academic curriculum.

At present we range in number from about ten to fifteen women, and are in need of an appropriate meeting space. Since we are an 'academic' group of lesbians on campus, we are hoping that the Research Centre can meet our request so that we can locate ourselves, as both a lesbian and an academic group, within the parameters of the university research community.
