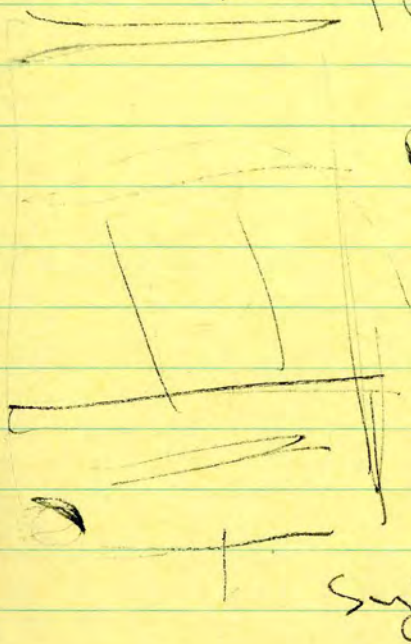

CRIAW IS COMING!

15th Annual CRIAW Conference
Edmonton, Alberta
November 8 to November 10, 1991

GLOBAL VISION GLOBALE/LOCAL ACTION LOCALE

The 1991 CRIAW Conference will be co-hosted by the Misener/Margetts Women's Research Centre and the Women's Program and Resource Centre of the Faculty of Extension in Edmonton, Alberta. The theme for this year's conference emphasizes the relationship between local knowledge and action and the larger "global" feminist vision. (see back page for details)

REPORT ON CRIAW 1990

The Canadian Institute for the Advancement of Women (CRIAW) conference was held in Charlottetown, PEI November 16-18, 1990 at the Prince Edward Hotel. Just over 300 women attended. The theme "The more we get together, the happier we'll be" is from an old song to which the conference brought new meaning. Through open discussion and sharing we strengthened our understanding of ourselves and each other. Focussing on women with disabilities, the gathering raised the need for women of varying degrees of ability to join together and include the experiences of women with disabilities.

Joan Meister, past-chair of DisAbled Women's Network (DAWN) gave an emotionally moving keynote address about defining disability. At the luncheon Saturday, Monique Begin, former Liberal cabinet minister, spoke about "The Report on the Royal Commission on the Status of Women - Twenty Years Later". She pointed out that none of the radical or structural recommendations have been implemented and that violence against women was hardly mentioned in the report. On Sunday at noon we remembered the 14 women massacred as well as those who were disabled in Montreal, Dec. 6, 1989.

The program was a skillfully woven curriculum of papers, workshops and discussion groups on a range of research issues, including the experiences of women with disabilities. Topics for sessions included: working with women rather than just studying them; violence and abuse; disabled women's experiences in the world and in the women's movement; feminist instruction; dialogues on marginalization; women and caregiving with the elderly; disability defined; finding our voice; transforming our world; a study of the experiences of students enrolled in women's studies at three maritime universities; and many more.

The organizing committee had attended to the finest detail. Claiming the space by renaming all the meeting rooms was a powerful strategy to create a woman-centred environment. Rooms were named after prominent Canadian women such as Pauline Johnson, Therese Casgrain and Judy LaMarsh.

The annual general meeting marked the end of Marilyn Assheton-Smith's term as president of CRIAW. Jerri Wine stepped into the position and was joined by a number of new board members. Jerri will guide the organization until we meet in Edmonton, November 8 - 10, 1991.

I can't finish without one last comment. The absolute highlight of the weekend came for me Saturday night. We had worked hard all day and we were ready for the entertainment provided by Blythe Spirits (Joanne Ings, Evie Carnet and Glenda Landry). They were simply grand with their coy renditions of "songs we hate to love". What a hoot - 300 feminists singing "Going to the Chapel", "My Boyfriend's Back" and "It's My Party".

As hosts of the 1991 CRIAW conference we must strive to maintain the high standard of excellence set by the women who organized the conference in Charlottetown including the powerful entertainment. Hope you will come help make it a success.

The Misener/Margetts Women's Research Centre, now in its third year of operation, actively promotes women-centred research by both academic women and women who perform action-research outside academia.

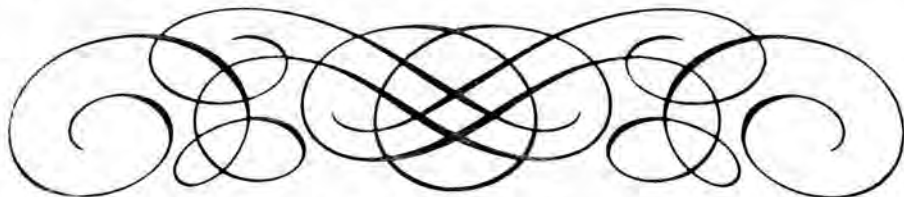
The Research Centre sponsored the 3rd Annual Feminist Research Forum Sept. 21 and 22, 1990, in which over 25 women presented their research findings in the areas of Women in the Arts; Women in the Workplace; Feminist Theory and Practice; and Women and Health. The theme of this year's Forum - Celebrating Women's Communities - promoted a focus for discussion on the ways in which women are moving beyond victimization into positions of strength and empowerment. Forum attendance, at over 140 registrants, saw a 30% increase over 1989 figures. The many comments from those that attended are appreciated and will be helpful in future planning.

The M/M Centre's series of fall and winter research presentations is underway. On October 17, Jean Noble spoke on "Lesbian S/M - Moving Beyond For and Against Arguments Towards an Analysis of Cultural Meanings."

On January 23, Mary Johnson spoke on the Women's Health Collective and the struggles and successes experienced by a group of Edmonton women while trying to establish an independent/interdisciplinary health centre that will address our unique health care issues and requirements.

The U of A Women's Centre Collective meets Monday mornings at 10:00 a.m. in the M/M Research Centre. The Centre has become "home" for a number of groups that meet regularly: a spirituality group, a reading group and a Lesbian Research group.

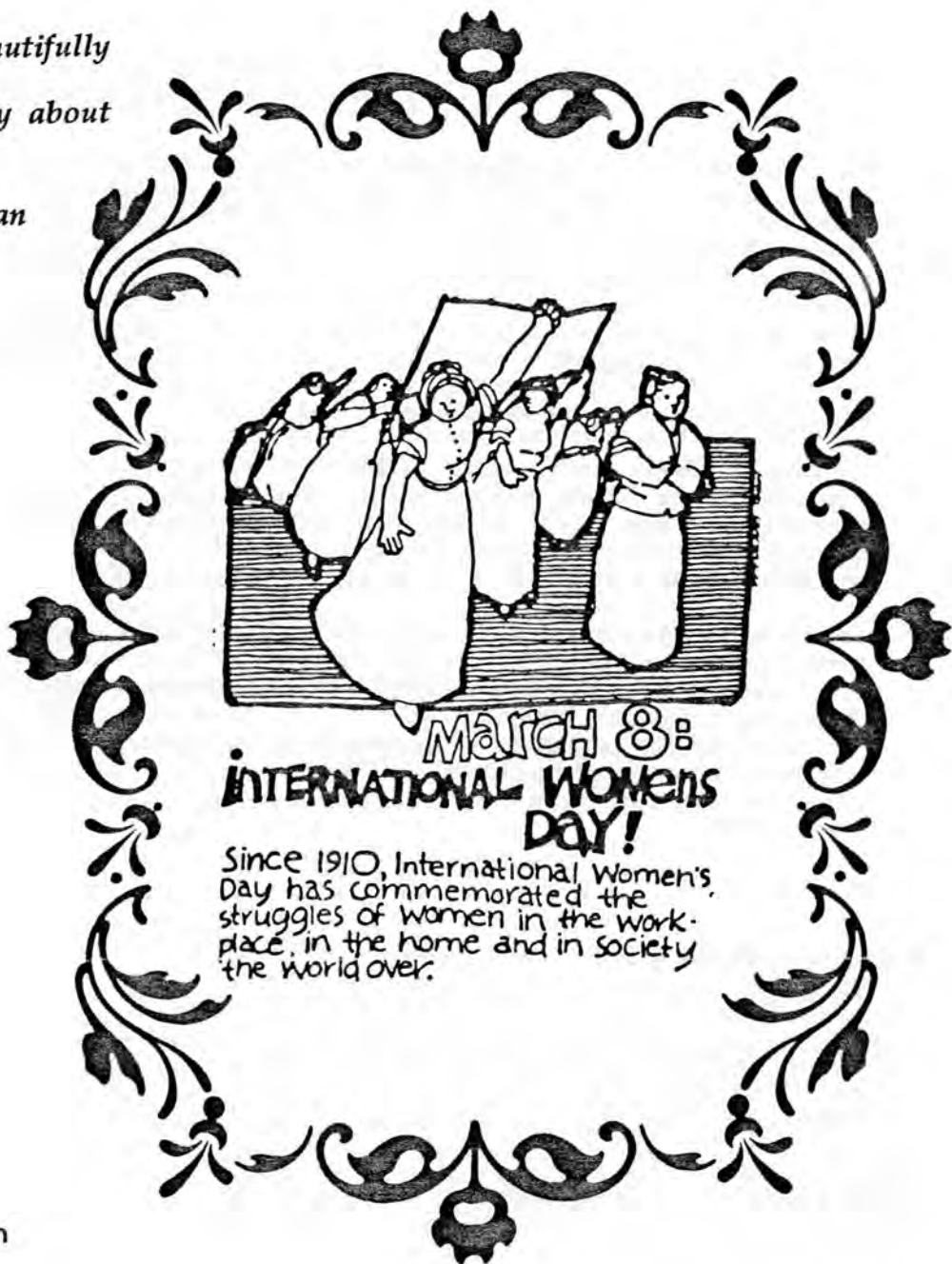

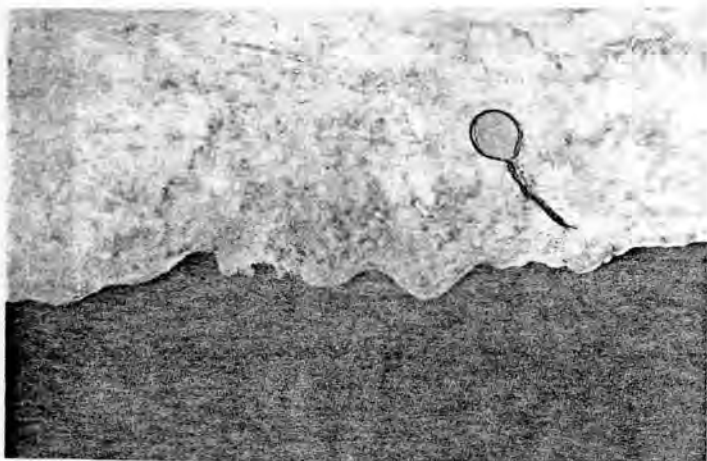

CRIAW 1991 CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

We are looking for presentations/papers in which the feminist researcher or community activist clearly "locates" herself in relation to her work and then, as part of her discussion, creates links between different fields and perspectives (the "global" context). Ways in which you might locate yourself include your physical abilities/disabilities, religion, social class, race, ethnicity, immigration status, age, First Nations' status, sexual orientation, geographic location and so on. The critical thing is to add to your study a reflection on the way in which your social "location" influences/shapes/determines your work in more global research arenas which may include areas such as health, the family, education, employment, film, text, law, etc. The Program Committee will ensure that related papers/presentations are placed together on the program so that presenters and participants can consider relationships and identify possible linkages among women and the diverse issues being addressed.

As with all CRIAW Conferences, a variety of forms of presentations will be welcomed by the Program Committee. These include workshops, networking sessions or round tables (in which someone provides leadership for a topic which all come prepared to discuss), film, poetry and other forms of text, papers (to which the presenter should speak for no more than twenty minutes), dramatic vignettes, poster sessions, and philosophical and methodological issues relating to the conference theme.

Criteria for selection will include recognition of the connection made between "location" and its "global" context and a clear feminist or "woman-centred" focus. Please send proposals, including a one-page abstract of the work, to the 1991 CRIAW/ICREF Conference, Misener/Margetts Women's Research Centre, 11043-90 Ave., U of A Campus, Edmonton, AB T6G 2E1. Proposals must be postmarked no later than March 15, 1991. More detailed descriptions of the session (as, for example, a formal paper if that is your plan) should be sent to the committee by October 15, 1991.

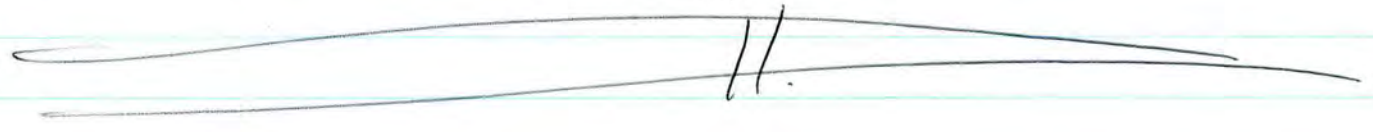
