INTRODUCTION

This first edition of Guide to Women's Information Resources in Edmonton has been prepared to facilitate access to the vast amount of printed information available for/about women in Edmonton-area libraries and resource centres. The Guide is intended as an aid to students, researchers, and members of the general public.

An effort has been made to list a broad spectrum of information centres -- from feminist organizations to large public libraries. The completed listing of 43 libraries/resource centres provides a guide to collections of books, periodicals, pamphlets, brochures, audio-visual material, government documents, and newspaper clippings.

In addition to directory-type information (library/resource centre address, telephone, hours of opening, and contact person) the Guide provides a brief profile of the library/resource centre, a listing of the information services offered, a summary of the primary women-related subjects collected, and an indication of whether the collection circulates externally and how it is accessed internally. Special features are noted. Services listed are only those provided by the library/resource centre to the general public. The Guide is arranged alphabetically by library/resource centre name with a subject index provided at the back.

Please note: The subject headings used are not limited to female-specific subjects (e.g. abortion), but also include headings that may be of general interest to women (e.g. aging, health, labour, law).

We would like to thank the staff of the various libraries and resource centres for their assistance and cooperation.
