PRIME is a computer file which lists the research interests and expertise of University staff members. It is intended to aid the University community and those from outside the University who wish to identify persons having specific knowledge or expertise. The Office of Research Services, working in liaison with departments and faculties, has completed a major revision of this file. Over 1000 of the 1700 researchers on staff are now on the system.

The attached letter displays the information concerning your research activities and interests as it appears in PRIME, and includes instructions for accessing the file.

Due to SPIRES system requirements we found it necessary to edit keyword lists. Punctuation marks, most conjunctions (including 'and') and prepositions are not acceptable within keyword expressions. In addition, some keywords were standardized to reflect the most common usage by researchers with related interests. You may notice that changes have been made to your keyword lists. Please notify us if you find any edits to be inappropriate.

PRIME has been made public and available to anyone with access to Computing Services' facilities. The entire contents of this file - or segments of it - may also be printed. Information as detailed in the PRIME tutorial will allow users to select their own listings by Faculty, Department, Name or Keyword. There have been requests for listings from several potential contractors, from the private and public sectors, from the media, and from researchers seeking collaborators.

Please use the file. We welcome suggestions for any improvements or enhancements.
