Superintendents-General of Indian Affairs 1868 - 1873

*** The offices of Secretary of State of Canada, Registrar General and Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs were created by Statute 31 Vict., c. 42 (May 22, 1868). By this Act, the Secretary of State of Canada was to hold these latter two offices ex officio.; the duties and powers of the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs were transferred to the Secretary of State for the Provinces and were exercised by him until July 1, 1873.

The office of Secretary of State for the Provinces was abolished and the office of Minister of the Interior created by Statute 36 Vict. c. 4 (in force July 1, 1873). By this Act the Minister was to be ex officio the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs.

Department of the Interior (July 1, 1873)

*** Until 1883 the Minister of the Interior was ex officio the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs. Statute 46 Vict., c.6 (May 25, 1883) provided for the Minister of the Interior, or the head of any other department appointed for that purpose by the Governor in council, to hold the office ex officio. Order in Council (Oct 17, 1883) designated the President of the Privy Council as Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs. On Oct 3, 1887 the office was transferred back to the Minister of the Interior, who, except for a brief period in 1930, continued to hold the office until its abolition in 1936.

*** The Minister of the Interior was ex officio the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs until Jun 19, 1930, when the Minister of Immigration and Colonization was designated by Order in Council to hold the office ex officio. That Order in Council was cancelled on Aug 7, 1930 and the Minister of the Interior again held the office ex officio.
