Dear Senator:

I hope you are enjoying good health.

Possibly you will recall our conversation at the last Congocation U. of C. as to the possibility of My Golden West offering an opportunity to members of creative writing two or journalism & Literature. We would agree to publish the four we judge as top and offer a \$50.00 prize to the winner. The amount offered seems very small, however, My Golden West is still having a difficult financial time. We are, however, increasing our circulation and are still in the leading hotels and nearly all the Public School Libraries, Elementary and High, most Colleges and most Private Schools. We also expect to run an Edmonton Section in the coming year. Every year our magazine has won a Canadian Women's Press Clubs' Award, and recently Canada Month asked permission to reprint one of our editorials, so I do feel the young writers would receive some recognition from the public by being published in our magazine. I only wish our prize money could be more, possibly it should be granted only as a partial payment of fees for another course. I leave that to your discretion.

We would in each article mention the author was a student at the Banff School of Fine Arts writing course who had won an award for the article. This might benefit your school slightly.

Our one request on the material received is that it must be Western Canadian in content, about either the present or the past, and it could be either an article or a story. Length must range from 1,000 to 3,000 words.

I do wish we could offer more remuneration but after all Saturday Post went under so you can guess the difficult problems we are having in publishing our magazine.
