## Details for Forum (Facilities etc).

### 1. Food and Coffee:



### 3rd Annual Feminist Research Forum

#### "Celebrating Women's Communities"

On September 21st and 22nd, the Women's Research Centre will host its third research forum. The location will be the Education North Building, room 2-115, on the University campus. This year's forum will be a celebration of women's research, focusing on formal and informal research as well as knowledge generation. The forum promises to be highly interactive both in terms of content and organization.

To begin the forum, Dr. Jeri Wine from the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education will be the Friday night guest speaker. Her topic will be "Everyday Violence Against Women". Following this, C.R.I.A.W. will co-sponsor a wine and cheese. On Saturday, there will be four sessions running concurrently at three different intervals, beginning the day with a morning plenary. Topics include: Women in the Arts with sessions on film, text, and drama; Women in the Workplace with sessions on entrepreneurship, the strength of women working together, and ghettoized women's professions; Feminist Theory and Practice with sessions on methodology, pedagogy, and a generational dialogue; and Women and Health with sessions on PMS, and menopause, as well as a session on co-dependency.

The forum will close with a plenary on Women and Spirituality.

Advance registration will be available in the brochures which will be mailed out to members shortly. Brochures may also be picked up from the Centre, the Women's Program and Resource Centre, and various locations on and around campus; or call 492-8950 and leave a message. The fee for registration will be \$20, with a sliding scale dependent upon income. We hope to see you there!


Dear Friends;
