Plenary sessions are planned with invited key-note speakers. Plans include a panel which would consist of representatives from CRIAW, Match International and two or three representatives from "third world" organizations, entitled: "Spinning Local Thread/Weaving Global Feminism".

A round-table which would include women from organizations in the "Third World" is also under consideration. This would be a regular session during the conference under the title: "Global Perspectives on Changing Local Communities: Sharing Experiences".

A call for presentations has already been sent out. A number of proposals has already been received and accepted. Our diversities, our differences, are "local", aspects of our immediate experience and realities; our commonalities are "global" as we seek to understand our situation as women and create positive change not only for women but for all people between their local action and research as it is influenced by, and potentially has an impact on, events in larger contexts, be they with respect to the province, the country, or the world. Thirdly, we want to provide a forum for participants to identify paths for action in the situation they are researching or in the community work in which they are involved.

Thus, we see the conference as a "meeting place" for CRIAW as a country-wide organization, but a meeting place open to participants in and outside of that organization. In this "meeting", each of us is encouraged to carry a strong sense of our "place", for example, our ethnicity, or our regional location in Canada. 
